Terry Fox 2015 Thank-you—Peter, VA3WET

I would like to thank Henry, Va3OV; David, Ve3RNF; Sheldon, Ve3XI, Denis, Ve3KVE and Garth, Ve3HO for your help at the Niagara Falls Terry Fox Run. The organizers could not thank us enough for our participation. The run collected \$42,819.45.

The club mustered at the entrance to Oakes Park on Morrison Avenue in Niagara Falls between 9:00 am and 9:30 am on Sunday September 20th.

Peter, Va3WET set up the base station using a broom handle dipole hanging twenty feet above the ground from a tree. We were simplex on 147.500 Mhz. Our back up frequency was the VE3NRS repeater. All stations checked in with no difficulties. The run began at 11:08 after some announcements.

David, VE3RNF was stationed on Portage Road between the railway tracks and the feeder canal path. Henry, Va3OV was at the junction of Morrison Street and Portage Road. Garth, Ve3HO was watching Virginia Street, Elizabeth Street and Thorold Stone Road. Denis, Ve3KVE was at the same location as last year. He was at the junction Thorold Stone Road and the feeder canal path. Sheldon, Ve3XI was stationed in the middle of the feeder canal path between Thorold Stone Road and Portage Road. The run distance was 5 km and some runners and cyclists did the course twice.

We had to contend with two issues during the event. The first was unauthorized traffic on the course. Garth, Ve3HO put himself in harms way to keep traffic away from the walkers and runners. The second issue was a lost child brought to our attention by David, Ve3RNF. A distraught grandfather reported to David that he had become separated from his seven year-old grandson, Adam. Adam was on a scooter. This was reported to the Run officials. All members and run organizers were on the watch for Adam. Sheldon, Ve3XI walked the feeder canal trail in search of Adam. Approximately five (5) minutes later, Adam showed up at the start/finish line and was reunited with his grandfather. The walk wrapped up at 1pm. The group went to a local watering hole for milk and cookies and discussed the days events. We agreed to do this again next year.

Thank-you everyone for coming out for this worth while event. It is another feather in the NPARC cap. Your volunteerism will be recognized at the October General Meeting.

I received a call Friday, September 25th from Niagara Mini-storage that a smaller unit was now available. We could have it under one condition, all contents must be moved by Tuesday. Once I snagged a helper, David Ve3RNF, I called back to say we will take the unit. I sent out an email and call to arms to the membership on Saturday announcing volunteers needed Sunday morning at 10 am.

It was a perfect beautiful sunny and cool day for the move. When we arrived the pad lock on our unit would not function. We all gave it a try to no avail. Oscar volunteered his industrial strength mini grinder and went home to fetch it while the rest of the gang continued to try the lock. I went to Home Depot to purchase a new lock. our vehicles we moved all the club inventory to the new location and carried by hand the larger items such as tables and shelving.

A second trip was needed to Home Depot for a box of #8 1x1/2" wood screws to repair the existing shelving. The move caused the original short screws to pull out and the shelving to be very wobbly. David, Ve3RNF had brought his portable, variable speed, reversing drill fore-shadowing such a necessity.

Items from storage will be auctioned at the October Meeting. I have a transformer and some metal shelving. We also have several mismatched folding chairs, rotor control cable and other goodies we hope to sell. An old box full of QSL cards was found. They will be scanned into the archives. The club antennas DID NOT have to be cut to fit inside the unit.

There you have it fellow members. Anything not in storage will be at the October Auction. I hope to see you there and thank-you again to everyone who helped with the move. Cheers and gd dx.

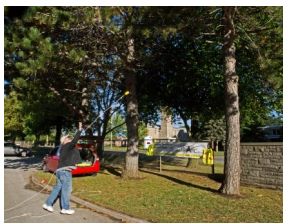

Study Guides

[Radio Amateurs of Canada](#) offers the following study guides to help you learn the things you'll need to pass your exam and have fun with amateur radio:

Morse Code may be learned in a class or by self-study using a number of methods. A popular way is to download a software program that teaches the Morse Code and provides drills at progressively higher speeds until the student is ready for the examination.

It should be noted that, while Morse Code is almost extinct in the commercial radio services, it still has wide usage in amateur radio. As proficiency speeds beyond the five words per minute is desirable, it is important to learn and practice the Morse Code so as not to inhibit your own future speed development. Accepted practice is to use what is known as the Farnsworth Method whereby character speed is faster than the word speed, allowing longer timing spaces for comprehension.

One of the most popular Morse Code learning and practice programs is called [Morse Academy](#).

Though you won't be able to fully apply the information until you start operating your station, you will find the information in the following desk reference book of considerable value:

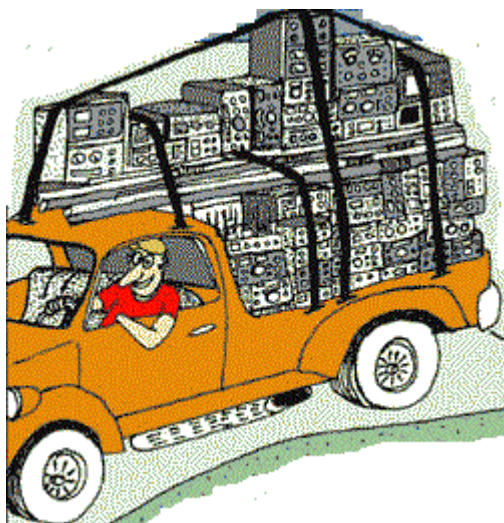
