

Phil McBride was present at the November meeting and gave a very informative presentation on ONTARIO REGULATION 366/09, "Display Screens And Hand-held Devices".

I have been asked to include the Regulation in this month's Feedline.

I have included it at the end to make it easy for those who do not wish to include it while printing out their Feedline. I am including though, the current exemptions as retrieved from the MTO website.

Are there any exemptions to Ontario's distracted driving law?

When driving, you are not permitted to use hand-held communication and entertainment devices or view display screens unrelated to the driving task, with the following exceptions:

- Calling 9-1-1 in an emergency situation
- When the driver is lawfully parked or has safely pulled off the roadway and is not impeding traffic.

Note: It is dangerous to stop on the shoulder of a 400-series highway and drivers are prohibited from pulling off a designated 400-series highway and parking for a reason other than an emergency. If the situation is not an emergency, drivers are advised to exit the freeway at an interchange or pull into the nearest service centre.

Commercial and public transit drivers, as well as public service workers who are engaged in the performance of their duties, will be able to view the display screens of mobile data terminals and logistical tracking and dispatching devices. Specified commercial, public transit, and public function drivers, as well as licensed amateur radio operators, are permitted hand-held use of their two-way ("CB") radios (exemption to expire January 1, 2018).

Other devices not included in the ban:

- Viewing a display screen used for collision avoidance systems
- Viewing a display screen of an instrument, gauge or system that provides information on the conditions, use and immediate environment of the vehicle or that provides road or weather information
- Ignition interlock
- Car audio screens that display still images

Unlike CB or mobile radios (two-way radios), devices like hand-mikes and portable radios (walkie-talkies) do not have a microphone connected to a separate receiver. These devices may not be used as hand-held devices, but may be may be used in a hands-free manner. Drivers may use a lapel button or press a button on the device to transmit or receive voice communication as long as the hand-mike or walkie-talkie is mounted or secured and is not being held while driving.

Viewing display screens of a mobile data terminal is allowed for commercial purposes. These devices provide operational information from a dispatcher or control centre, and are essential to commercial operations, including licensed taxi and limousine services, couriers, tow truck and roadside assistance services. Many public services, including public transit, also rely on these devices.

Study Guides

<u>Radio Amateurs of Canada</u> offers the following study guides to help you learn the things you'll need to pass your exam and have fun with amateur radio:

Morse Code may be learned in a class or by self-study using a number of methods. A popular way is to download a software program that teaches the Morse Code and provides drills at progressively higher speeds until the student is ready for the examination.

It should be noted that, while Morse Code is almost extinct in the commercial radio services, it still has wide usage in amateur radio. As proficiency speeds beyond the five words per minute is desirable, it is important to learn and practice the Morse Code so as not to inhibit your own future speed development. Accepted practice is to use what is known as the Farnsworth Method whereby character speed is faster than the word speed, allowing longer timing spaces for comprehension.

One of the most popular Morse Code learning and practice programs is called <u>Morse Academy</u>.

Though you won't be able to fully apply the information until you start operating your station, you will find the information in the following desk reference book of considerable value:


