Duties are as follows:

President - The president shall be the spokesman for the club. The president shall preside over all executive meetings and meetings of members. The president shall be a member ex-officio of all committees;

Vice-President - The vice-president shall perform all duties assigned by the president and, in the absence of the president, shall perform all the duties of the president. The vice-president shall, excluding repeater equipment, maintain or oversee the maintenance of a current directory of non-monetary assets and shall be accountable to the membership for this listing of assets but not for the actual assets listed;

Repeater Committee Chairperson—With the assistance of the members of the repeater committee, this chairman shall oversee the function of the committee which is to properly and legally operate and main-

tain the club's repeater equipment for the benefit of and use by club members and, as club policy may permit, amateur radio operators in general. Also, this chairman shall maintain, or oversee the maintenance of, a current directory of repeater equipment and shall be accountable to the membership for this listing of repeater equipment but not for the actual equipment listed.
